Galway U20 footballer Daniel Cox led the way for Bish scoring 0-6 (1f) over the 60 minutes. Bish dominated the first half and aided by a significant wind built up an unassailable lead with a nicely taken goal by Darragh O'Malley being supplemented by points from Ethan Fiorentini, Aaron Kavanagh and Daniel O'Flatherty. With good movement from Liam Melody, David Hurley and Tom O'Connor, the Nathy's defenders were no match for the Bish forward unit.

Early in the second half PJ Ward kept the Roscommon side at bay with a super save. Resolute defending from Conor Corcoran, Josh Ruffley, Aaron Flynn and Rory McDonnell kept the Nathy's forwards quiet which gave a great platform for Conal Gallagher and Evan Nolan to dominate in midfield. A Gary Higgins penalty sealed a brilliant win for the Bish lads in the second half. Bish were due to play Patrician Academy, Mallow in the All Ireland semi-final on March 21st but this was postponed due to the ongoing Covid-19 crisis. Here's hoping we return to school in the near future and get a chance to challenge for an All-Ireland title. Well done to the whole Bish squad.
