#### JOHN LOUGHLIN RETIRES






From a being a student in the mid 1990's to a teacher in the 2010's the "Bish" provided John a place to combine both his interest, dedication and talent for science, teaching and sport. With respect to science John was a very active member of the local Galway/Mayo branch of the Irish Science Teachers Association (ISTA) and was for the last few years the treasurer of the local branch. He played a very active role within the organisation and in 2014 brought its annual conference to NUI Galway under the banner "Inspiring Science from Irelands Silicon Valley". In 2018 John took on the role of national Chairperson and was heavily involved in consulting with and providing feedback to the NCCA on the changes that were due to the Junior Science and Biology syllabus specifications.

As a student John was an active member of the "Bish" athletics teams excelling in both track/field and cross country. When he joined the teaching staff he coached alongside Mr Derek Murray and true to form John brought the same methodology, dedication and perfection to coaching athletes as did to teaching his students. He contributed to bringing numerous South Connacht and Connacht titles back to "Bish" over the years at various age grades. This success cumulated in a historic All Ireland Intermediate 4x100m relay title in June 2016. It should be noted that this competition is notoriously difficult to medal in with the "Bish" taking Gold in a photo finish winning by 1/100th of a second. John was away in Belgium on science business on the day but showing true dedication to the sport he managed to get a live stream of the race to witness the history unfolding. As well as track and field John, also a keen soccer enthusiast, also contributed handsomely to the success to the blue and white of the school's soccer teams. In 2015, the U17 team under his coaching and guidance won both Connacht and All-Ireland titles beating Presentation College Athenry in the Connacht decider and winning the All-Ireland title on a nervous penalty shootout against Colaiste Choilm, Ballincollig


John is and will always be remembered as a highly accomplished, professional and dedicated teacher. In his 11 years here, he excelled in teaching Biology, Science and Maths and quickly established himself within the school and in the field of education. In his role as an assistant examiner in Higher Level Biology he combined his knowledge of the subject and syllabus to write his Leaving Certificate Biology text book "Bio", this well-regarded text book is still being used in our classroom today. In November 2020 John left the "Bish" and the teaching profession to take up the role as Chief Examiner within the State Exams Commission and it is with that we all wish him the very best of luck.


